**ORDER HOLDING IN ABEYANCE DECISION ON THE CITY OF MEMPHIS'S
PROPOSED SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY**

On December 21, 2019, the City of Memphis submitted its proposed social media policy for the Memphis Police Department. (ECF No. 268.) The Parties have informed the Court that several outstanding issues related to the social media policy for the City may be resolved by the upcoming Modification Hearing set for June 17, 2020. In light of the Parties' ongoing mediation related to proposed modifications to the Kendrick Consent Decree, the Court holds in abeyance its decision on the City's proposed social media policy until after the issues to be presented to the Court at the Modification Hearing are resolved.
